Al Tucker Jr. Born 2/24/1943

Albert "Al" A. Tucker Jr. was born in Dayton, Ohio, February 24th, 1943. Albert Tucker Sr., his father, was a player for the Harlem Globetrotters in 1940.

Impressed by their skills on the basketball court, AI & his brother Gerald Tucker were recruited by Oklahoma Baptist University. AI Tucker Jr. played basketball for three seasons, setting a number of records, some of which are still unbroken more than 50 years later.

After college, Al Tucker Jr. played four seasons in the NBA and one season in the American Basketball Association. Notably, Al Tucker Jr. was the Seattle SuperSonics' first ever NBA draft pick, selected 6th in the 1967 NBA draft.

Playing for the Seattle SuperSonics, Cincinnati Royals, Chicago Bulls, Baltimore Bullets, and The Floridians, Al Tucker Jr. averaged 10.1 points per game and earned NBA All-Rookie Honors at the end of his first NBA season.

Albert Tucker Jr. died May 7th, 2001 at the age of 58. He and his parents are buried in section 111, lot 3797 at Woodland Cemetery; just behind our restored historic chapel.

Woodland Centenarian Club:

Clara Dickens (1798 - 1/23/1908)

The photo (right) and following article were originally published by The Dayton Herald, 1/25/1908 pg. 12:

"Family Records Show That This [/] Lady Was 110 Years Old -

The funeral of Mrs. Clara Dickens, one of the most respected [/] women in the city, was held Saturday afternoon from the Zion Baptist Church, and the services were attended by a large number of friends and others.

Rev. W.O. Harper, the pastor of the church, officiated. Burial was made at Woodland Cemetery. Mrs. Dickens had reached the advanced age of 110, and had reared a family [sic] twelve children, nine of whom have died. Her husband has been dead 43 years.



Mrs. Dickens lived at 1019 Stillwater avenue. The family records show that this respected [/] lady reached the unusual age of 110 years.

She was born in Charleston, S.C., and came to Dayton in 1884. Twelve children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Dickens, nine of whom are dead and three survive—Caleb and Charles Dickens and Mrs. Cornelius McKnight. About three years ago her faculties became impaired, and at times she was quite feeble and childish in demeanor.

Until that time, however, the aged lady interestingly told of her early life and of events associated with the community in which she was born.

She was well known in local [/] circles, and by all who knew her held her in the highest esteem [sic.]"

SICSA will be on site with information about their organization, how you can get involved and make a difference in a pet's life!


